06		Athol Hall – listen to this stop in front of Athol Hall.	15		Urban Fringe – listen to this stop at the beginning of the row of houses.
07		Eastern Water Dragons – listen to this stop when the canopy opens out and you can see the Sydney Harbour Bridge through the trees.	16	St.m	Japanese Midget Submarines – listen to this stop at the small lookout facing west along the urban fringe section of the track.
08		Angophora Forest – listen to this stop at the lookout platform facing the city.	17		Little Penguins – listen to this stop at the clearing overlooking Chowder Bay.
09		Cannon Battery – listen to this stop at the cannon battery above Bradleys Head.	18		Clifton Gardens – listen to this stop at Chowder Bay.

HOW TO USE THIS AUDIO TOUR

The tour starts at Circular Quay, includes a stop for the ferry trip to Taronga Zoo Wharf and follows the headland track around Bradleys Head to Chowder Bay. There are stops to listen to at Circular Quay, during the ferry trip and the remaining stops are along the track. Information on where to stop and listen is provided above. The tour is best listened to in order. The track is unpaved so wear good walking shoes and take water and sunblock with you. **The tour from Circular Quay to Chowder Bay will take approximately 2 hours.**



GETTING THERE:

You can catch a bus, train or ferry to Circular Quay. Tickets for the ferry to Taronga Zoo Wharf can be purchased at the ferry wharves at Circular Quay. The ferry trip takes approximately 15 minutes.
