Blue Gum Hills Regional Park

ABOUT BLUE GUM HILLS RP

Blue Gum Hills RP is near Minmi, only 3 minutes from the F3 and 14 km west of the Newcastle CBD. It's an ideal location to enjoy a picnic or barbecue in a bushland setting with large open spaces for the kids to enjoy.

A themed playground reflects the mining history of the Minmi area. Seating and shelters allow parents to watch the children while they play, and an observation deck overlooks the large maze.

A number of easy-grade walking tracks provide pleasant strolls as they wind their way to historic Minmi Cemetery and Minmi Heritage Garden. Dogs are allowed on a leash in this regional park.

Opening hours: 7.30 am to 8.00 pm (daylight saving) and 7.30 am to 5.00 pm (other times).

HERITAGE WALKING TRACK

(2.5 km – easy)

This walk commences at the remains of the 1870s ashlar stone bridge abutments and follows the original Minmi–Back Creek rail embankment to Brown's Colliery No. 2 Mine; it ends at a ventilation shaft which dates from the 1870s. Some of the original underground coal mining infrastructure remains (engine foundations and ventilation shaft), as well as open cut mining remnants.

VILLAGE GREEN PICNIC AREA

A large open grassed area with picnic shelters, tables and free gas barbecues provides an ideal location for families and large groups to enjoy this peaceful bush setting. With great spaces for children to cycle, this picnic area is only 500 m from the main entry gates.

BACK CREEK PICNIC AREA

You'll find picnic facilities set in open bushland which provide a peaceful spot for your enjoyment. Explore the nearby playgrounds and the maze. You can enjoy an easy stroll to the historic Minmi Cemetery and the cemetery lookout.

TREETOP ADVENTURE PARK

This award-winning adventure park is a great way to actively enjoy the surrounding bushland. Move from tree to tree across the tree canopy through a network of rope bridges, flying foxes, trapezes and a Tarzan jump. This private park is located within the Blue Gum Hills Regional Park.
